



## Sexual Exploitation and Abuse (SEA) is a crime and must be reported

- It is your right to receive aid or help from organizations or service providers who work in your communities
- If employees of organizations or government working in your community ask for sexual favours or abuse you or someone you know before providing help, they are committing a crime and should be reported to the relevant authorities
- Sexual exploitation and abuse can be perpetrated by the following, but not limited to:
  - Teachers
  - Police
  - Employees of organizations or service providers
  - Health workers
  - United Nations staff providing aid in your community.



## **Assistance is Free!**

- No one has a right to demand
  - Money
  - Sex
  - Favours
- You have a right to receive the aid or help organizations or service providers bring to your community,

## **Report any Sexual Exploitation and Abuse**

- Report if someone forces you to pay for the aid and services,
- You can report sexual exploitation and abuse done against you or someone else
- Reporting sexual exploitation and abuse is important..
- Reporting sexual exploitation and abuse will not prevent you from getting assistance.
- All information you will provide when reporting a sexual exploitation and abuse case will be treated with confidentiality.
