

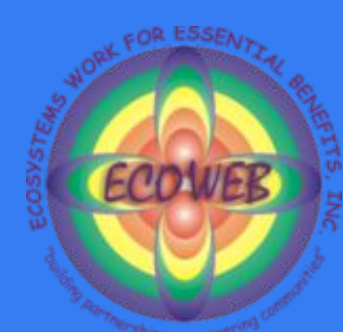
Bottom-Up Partnerships in Action: Upholding Dignity and Rights through the sclr Approach

- A transformative model enabling communities to lead their recovery.
- Shifts power dynamics while upholding the **dignity and rights** of people affected by crises.

Core Principles:

- Empowers communities to define priorities, respecting their agency and decision-making.
- Operates through **four levels of partnerships** fostering leadership, resilience, and sustainability.
